

Legislative Update Week 17
May 7, 2022

We're in the final countdown for the 2nd regular session of the 124th South Carolina General Assembly.

This upcoming week is the final week of the session with Thursday, May 12th being Sine Die, the last day of the regular legislative session. Legislators will return in June for budget purposes and other matters.

Top 3 Things to Know

1 Unencumbered Time Passes the House - A core priority of The SCEA Legislative Agenda has made its way closer to the finish line! Your collective voice and the advocacy of The SCEA resulted in the House saying "We hear you," and unanimously passing duty-free unencumbered time for educators.

The collective voice and advocacy of The SCEA resulted in the House *unanimously* passing duty-free unencumbered time for educators through <u>S.946</u>. The SCEA has worked hard to make sure this important legislation advanced this session.

Because this bill already unanimously passed in the Senate, the next step is for the Senate to vote on concurring or not concurring with the House passed version.

2 Senate votes to support aspiring educators - The Senate unanimously passed a

version of <u>H.3588</u>, the LIFE Scholarship bill that extends the Scholarship to include education majors, as well as a service requirement for education scholarship recipients to teach in South Carolina for each year they receive the scholarship. The next step is for the Senate to concur with the strengthened House version of the bill.

South Carolina is currently facing a five-alarm educator shortage crisis. Attracting and retaining educators has never been more urgent, and reducing the debt burden of aspiring educators working to become certified educators is one way to meaningfully attract talented new educators to the profession.
