# **House and Senate Recesses**

The House was on furlough and did not gavel into session this week. They will resume next Tuesday. The Senate will be on recess next week and will not return until Tuesday, April 16.

## **Education Budget Provisos**

On Wednesday, the Senate Finance K-12 Education Subcommittee met to discuss some of the provisos in the 2024-2025 budget, <u>H.5100</u>, all of which were adopted or carried over.

# S.1188: Expulsion Requirements

<u>S.1188</u> changes the notification requirements regarding student expulsion. Currently, as part of an expulsion procedure, the school board must schedule a hearing for the student and notify parents/legal guardians in writing. This bill requires the written notification to include explicit mention of the family's right to have legal counsel present at the hearing and the right to request the investigative file for the student.

The full Senate Education Committee gave this bill a favorable report on Wednesday and it passed the Senate in a <u>37-2</u> vote. It will now head over to the House.

# S.1158: Prohibiting Open Carry on School Grounds

Earlier this month, the Governor signed a <u>bill into law</u> that allows people over 18 to carry a weapon either concealed or openly without a permit. After that law was enacted, Sen. Shane Massey introduced <u>S.1158</u>, which prohibits students who are 18 or older from carrying a firearm on public school grounds, even if it is locked in their car.

On Wednesday, the Senate Judiciary Committee voted favorably on this bill, so it now goes to the Senate floor.

## **Statewide Primary Elections**

#### HB4548: EARNINGS LIMITATION (Oremus, M)

A BILL TO AMEND THE SOUTH CAROLINA CODE OF LAWS BY AMENDING SECTION 9-1-1790, RELATING TO THE EARNINGS LIMITATION FOR A RETIRED MEMBER OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA RETIREMENT SYSTEM UPON THE

RETURN TO COVERED EMPLOYMENT, SO AS TO PROVIDE THAT THIS LIMITATION DOES NOT APPLY TO MEMBERS WHO RETURN TO COVERED EMPLOYMENT AS A SCHOOL BUS DRIVER.

### HB4649: PRIVATE SECURITY SERVICES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

#### (Bannister, B)

A BILL TO AMEND THE SOUTH CAROLINA CODE OF LAWS BY ADDING SECTION 59-19-275 SO AS TO PROVIDE PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH MORE THAN FIFTEEN THOUSAND STUDENTS MAY USE CERTAIN SECURITY PERSONNEL TO PROMOTE SAFETY AND SECURITY ON SCHOOL PREMISES IF LICENSED AS A PROPRIETARY SECURITY BUSINESS, AND TO PROVIDE DISTRICTS REMAIN OBLIGATED TO USE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW; BY AMENDING SECTION 40-18-60, RELATING TO PROPRIETARY SECURITY BUSINESS LICENSURE, SO AS TO ADD PROVISIONS CONCERNING PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS APPLYING FOR LICENSURE; BY AMENDING SECTION 40-18-80, RELATING TO SECURITY OFFICER REGISTRATION CERTIFICATION, SO AS TO PROVIDE THE SOUTH CAROLINA LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION SHALL IMPLEMENT CERTAIN RELATED TRAINING REQUIREMENTS; AND BY AMENDING SECTION 40-18-140, RELATING TO EXCEPTIONS FROM PRIVATE SECURITY AND INVESTIGATION AGENCY LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS, SO AS TO CLARIFY THAT PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS ARE EXCLUDED FROM THESE REQUIREMENTS.
